Yulun Wang, CEO of In Touch Technologies

Dr. Yulun Wang is an accomplished entrepreneur and world renowned authority on robotics in healthcare. In 1998, Dr. Wang was named South Coast Business and Technology Entrepreneur of the Year for his successes with Computer Motion, Inc. (now a wholly owned subsidiary of Intuitive Surgical [Nasdaq: ISRG]) which he founded in 1989. Computer Motion pioneered the medical robotics industry resulting in an IPO with a \$150 million valuation on \$16 million paid-in capital. Dr. Wang was the principal architect of Computer Motion's product line, which generated more than \$125 million in revenue, and performed over half a million surgical procedures. Dr. Wang led all of a company's various functions, including Sales & Marketing, R&D, intellectual property, finance, manufacturing and regulatory affairs. Dr. Wang has over 2 dozen patents, and in

September of 2000 was selected as one of the nation's top engineers to participate in the National Academy of Engineering's 2000 Frontiers of Engineering Symposium in Irvine, California. Dr. Wang has a Ph.D. in electrical engineering specializing in robotics from the University of California, Santa Barbara.
